  - a. No report from AL
  - b. GA report increase in enrollment, have been declines in Human Geography course offerings.
  - c. Kentucky only three responses from Universities, possibly issues with connection to SEDAAG. "All those who answered were connected to growth and more GISciences. UKY worried about geography and the state, moving toward the interdisciplinary nature of geography. Kentucky does not have a good fit with SEDAAG, how can we create more of a connection?
  - d. Mississippi Two of eight responses, stability in the departments. Large cuts in departments that may come across the state.
  - e. North Carolina 14 programs in the state, four responses. The storm created issues for the state that caused issues in report responses.
  - f. South Carolina 7 institutions with major and minors. Divisions between Human and Physical, but healthy. Some transition in faculty and lines, but stable. Concern about the meeting of when it is held (week before Thanksgiving).
  - g. Tennessee 9 universities with 6 responses. Geography is doing well and coming back. Some decline in undergraduate courses, but increase in graduate courses. General growth in majors across the state.



- h. Virginia 11 universities in VA, received responses from 8, all in stable or growing condition.
- i. West Virginia 5 of 8 responses. Marshall is the only department with Geography fully in the department.
- j. Florida in good standing for the four universities that responded to the survey. Mostly Geosciences/Physical programs. Suggesting growth with AI and physical geography. Need more interaction with SEDAAG
- k. Useful if State Representatives can get contact for all students from that state as first time attendees at the end of the conference.
- 11. Vice President and Program Chair Report (Potter)
  - a. 400 registrants for this SEDAAG, paper sessions up 25, papers up 40. A general increase from last year.

- b. Slight decline in number of manuscript submissions, Nov-Oct 19 scholarly submissions (12 accepted).
- c. Operating surplus each year, but down from usual, but this is from a decreased download and click rate.
- d. Journal impact factor is 0.7 (middle of the road with Geography journals, most high impact regional journal in the United States. Determined by number of citations in the first year of publication.
- e. Updated guidelines on the website to allow for a five-day turnaround. Citations are no longer included in the length of an article.
